Grants Available for Community-Based Leadership Training!

Encouraging members to enhance their leadership ability, 2013 AIA President Mickey Jacob, FAIA, is awarding 10 grants for leadership training programs in 2013.

The grants will help offset the financial commitment of AIA members participating in programs outside of the architecture profession, such as those sponsored by a local or state chamber of commerce.

The purpose of the grants is to support members seeking to build on their expertise as leaders and create a larger network of leadership opportunities for members nationwide. Building a stronger and larger network of AIA member leaders means that the Institute is better prepared to become involved in political issues affecting community planning and development, or serve as spokespersons for issues important to the designed environment and quality of life in communities. Most importantly, more AIA members trained as leaders means they can bring meaningful insight as mentors to identify and support developing opportunities for more AIA members to participate in community -based leadership programs.

What Does AIA National Actually Do?

Not many of AIA National undertakings and activities are clearly communicated and filtered to the state and local levels, leaving component chapters to wonder what AIA National does with all the dues AIA National collects each year! In order to better communicate AIA National initiatives to our membership, we will feature a category from the *2012 Accomplishments* publication AIA National released at AIA National Grassroots in March.

This week we are featuring the "**Making a Difference**" category, which has five main focus areas under the umbrella topic of "Members":

Performance

AIA Components benefited from the launch of the AIA's "For Leaders" page on aia.org, which makes information more accessible. Following through with research completed in 2010, CACE Leadership and staff implemented Component Performance Criteria for analysis and action.

Service

A survey of AIA Contract Document users showed that 80 percent of respondents viewed their experience with Contract Documents as "outstanding" or "very good." Documents on Demand now lists 106 documents (up from 65 in 2011), sales of which increased 41 percent in 2012.

Support

Achieved all-time high customer satisfaction scores (Over 6.1 on a 7-point scale) for Contract Documents customer call centers, Tech Support, and Doc Info services, responding to over 40,000 calls and emails.

Clients

28,000 AIA Contract Documents users finalized over 800,000 AIA Contract Documents in 2012.

Incentives

AIA State & Local Government Relations team initiated three state policy campaigns to improve the business of architecture: financing for commercial building owners interested in pursuing deep energy retrofits, promoting policy solutions to design-build laws that will benefit the architectural profession, and analyzing a new project delivery method called Public Private Partnerships.
