### Happy Monday!


I hope you are all having a great start to your Monday and that you are enjoying the last rainy bit of October that we have left.

Placed on the Michigan State Register for Historic Places in 1978, and the National Register of Historic Places in 1985, the guest register records over 10,000 visitors who have enjoyed the splendor of this magnificent design. 
