AIA Michigan Committee Spotlight: The Committee On The Environment (COTE)

AIA Michigan supplements individual COTE chapter initiatives and shares environmental activities, resources and knowledge throughout the state. The AIA Michigan Committee on the Environment (COTE) is presently considering hosting a regionally-focused conference in collaboration with Canadian (Ontario) architects. The conference is intended to be an opportunity to present and discuss regionally-appropriate and locally-sourced architectural practices encompassing regional materials, vernacular architecture, and regionally appropriate design. A range of event formats are being considered to entice a wider regional draw, and to have architects (and other building professionals) from beyond the immediate area able to attend. In addition to the event programming, there has also been discussion concerning organized opportunities for either

group or self-conducted visits to noteworthy local buildings. As the program is further developed and potential sponsors are contacted, the scope and direction of the program can be further defined.

Anyone is welcome to join AIA Michigan Committee On The Environment. The committee has a conference call once a month and interested parties are welcome to join in. The next call-in meeting is February 11, 2013 at 11am. The upcoming international conference will be discussed and the COTE is looking for committee members for this event. Reminder: Important Public Hearing Concerning Proposed Continuing Education Changes!

A public hearing regarding the proposed changes on the Architect's Continuing Education Rules is set for Thursday, **March 14, 2013**, 9:00 am in Okemos, MI.

It has been speculated that the Michigan Board of Architects on Continuing Education plans on submitting changes to the rules based on NCARB recommendations. Proposed changes include: 12 hours HSW calendar year (not per our two year renewal cycle), and they will not carry forward into next year. If these rules pass in October 2013, they will likely go into effect in 2014.

The next Board of Architects meeting is on Thursday, **February 7, 2013** in Okemos and the HSW continuing education changes will

likely be on the discussion list. All licensed architects are strongly encouraged to attend the meeting on February 7th and the public hearing on March 14th. This proposed change will directly affect each and every licensed professional in the state and thus deserves our attention. Please note that attendance at the meetings will not entail public speaking, but both will be informative and will provide the opportunity to be heard if you desire.
