Unlicensed practice: GAC through AIA MI has these action options based on severity of infraction:

- 1) Educational letter from AIA MI
- 2) Cease & desist letter from AIA MI
- 3) <u>File a complaint with the State</u> (anyone can do this): the state will now investigate unlicensed practice, but need to document the violation
- 4) Prosecute (unfunded action)

- f. Safe Schools House sponsor – Rep. Senate sponsor - Sen.
- g. HB 5009 (2019) Mass Timber House sponsor – Rep. John Cherry
