STRATEGIC DESIGN - The Power of Framework Thinking

Distinguished Alumnus William J. Johnson, FASLA
Professor Emeritus, University of Michigan

Bill Johnson has focused on issues of environmental design throughout his 50 year career as planner, designer, teacher and academic administrator. A landscape architect by training, his early interests focused on broad-scale land development/protection strategies. He pioneered in shaping cross-disciplinary ways-of-working in filling land development programs to sensitive environmental conditions. His practice has ranged across projects of regional and community planning, urban design, long-range campus development, natural resource and historic preservation. His contributions emphasize the balancing of social, cultural and environmental values in problem-solving initiatives. The scope of his personal involvement ranges from designer to development strategist to facilitator in environmental conflict-resolution issues.

Bill has blended graduate-level teaching and professional practice throughout his career since 1958. Co-founder of Johnson, Johnson & Roy, Ann Arbor, Michigan in 1963, Mr. Johnson along with his two partners directed the expansion of that firm into a multi-office international practice. A professor of landscape architecture at the University of Michigan from 1958 through 1989, Mr. Johnson also served as Dean of the University's School of Natural Resources from 1975 to 1983. A Fellow of the American Society of Landscape Architects, Mr. Johnson received the Society's Gold Medal in 1986. He was the 1992 President of the Landscape Architecture Foundation, an American Planning Association member and remains a Professor Emeritus of the University of Michigan.

Since the completion of his Berkeley partnership with Harvard classmate Peter Walker as Peter Walker, William Johnson Partners (1992-97), Mr. Johnson has since centered his personal practice on Bainbridge Island, Washington, where as William Johnson Studio he devoted much of his consulting time as mentor and critic for the architectural firm of NBBJ, an international design practice with offices throughout the U.S. Bill is now centered in Holland, Michigan. He continues consulting assignments throughout the country, focusing on community development initiatives with special attention to environmental preservation and restoration principles.

I am interested in starting a Custom Residential Architects Network (CRAN) committee in Southeast Michigan. CRAN is AIA's newest Knowledge Community, and we have over 1,200 members nationally. I have served on the Advisory Group at AIA National for the past 4 years, and have found a supportive community of architects who specialize in custom residential projects, including new homes and additions/remodeling. On a national level, we organize a symposium for residential practitioners each fall-the recent symposium in Santa Fe was a rousing success! In addition, we have been organizing a publication of exemplary single-family residential design called Houses for All Regions, a series of short videos about residential architecture called CRANtv, a compilation of resources for residential architects and our clients, a quarterly newsletter, and much more...

There are many residential architects in Southeast Michigan, and I believe that we could all benefit from organizing meetings and events specifically for our needs. Because I am a sole practitioner, and I am still involved with CRAN on the national level, I don't have time to be the champion for starting a CRAN committee on the local level, but I would be happy to support someone with the vision and drive to do the heavy lifting.
