AIA Michigan Committee Spotlight: The Government Affairs Committee

The goal of the Government Affairs Committee ("GAC") is to establish a long-range plan to update laws affecting the profession of Architecture, through legislation, administrative law and legal advocacy. To achieve its goal, the GAC must develop, coordinate and expedite an annual, comprehensive, and pro-active plan for all government affairs, for review and approval by the Board of Directors of AIA Michigan. The GAC is not a policy-making body. The charge of the GAC is to investigate, debate, and recommend actions to the AIA Michigan Board of Directors that advance the interests of the profession, protect the health, safety and welfare of the public, and are consistent with AIA National polices. Upon receipt of final direction from the Board, the GAC will implement the policies, taking all necessary and reasonable measures within its authority.

Because the GAC's goals are long-term in nature, a "Big Picture" approach is required, encompassing awareness of, and interaction with not only architects, but engineers, landscape architects, land surveyors, contractors, interior designers, state and municipal governments, building officials, the Board of Architects, and others. Identifying

potential industry allies, key bureaucrats and legislators, and building and maintaining productive relationships is a continuing focus of the GAC. In order to succeed, the GAC must rely on the involvement of the entire membership of this Association.

The GAC meets several times a year in Lansing and organizes events, such as Legislative Day in Lansing and in the Upper Penninsula. Members raise funds to support legislative efforts and candidates who support the mission of the GAC. The GAC page on the AIA Michigan website has more information about what the GAC does, what current issues the committee is focused on and how you can be a citizen architect.

AIA Michigan Call for Interns!

AIA Michigan is currently seeking applications for interns for 2013. Up to two (2) spots are available for these paid, part-time positions totaling 15-20 hours per week. Interns will complete special projects in addition to general office tasks. One internship is specifically website management-focused, so HTML and Java experience is required. The internship duration is six (6) months and applications will be accepted until the positions are filled.
